#### **CAREERS UPDATE**



We have recently hosted representatives from Victoria University and Lincoln University who provided information about their programmes, accommodation options

and scholarships for Year 13 interested students.

A liaison staff representative from Otago University is booked to visit next term and I am also trying to confirm dates for Waikato and AUT. I encourage Y13 students who are university-bound to take advantage of these opportunities. It is a great way to gather upto-date information about the wide range of study options available for them in 2022.



Tapu Vea, (Pasifika liaison officer from Victoria University of Wellington),

met with Year 12 Pasifika students last week. Students reported that this was a worthwhile session where they could find out more about what it would be like to attend university and what opportunities are available for them in the future. It was a great opportunity to encourage them to set high goals and to build self-confidence in a supportive environment.

An introductory careers session for all Y13 students took place on Friday 26 February. During this time we focused on the broad range of options open to the boys – further study at a university, polytechnic or private provider, a GAP year, overseas exchange programmes, apprenticeships or moving directly into employment. We discussed how you might make the best decision for you, what qualifications and skills may be required and where to find the relevant information.

During Ranks students have been made aware of other opportunities including Defensive Driving courses, a New Zealand Defence Force experience in the holidays, scholarships for students of Māori and Pasifka descent who are interested in attending Otago University, programmes for Māori students who are interested in a health-related career at the University of Auckland and Career Week at PIHMS (a hotel management

school in New Plymouth). Various after-school jobs have also been advertised for the boys and information is posted on the Careers notice board.

Individual interviews with Y13 students have commenced and will continue for the rest of this term. All students will meet with either Shelley Oliver or me. This is an opportunity for each student to participate in a 'career conversation' where we can discuss where they are at regarding ideas and/or plans for next year. It gives us an opportunity to find out how we can support individuals to make decisions about their futures and to provide guidance about what they need to do in order to achieve their goals. Many students will be given printed information and/or booklets which they will hopefully bring home and discuss with you, their parents and whānau.

#### Dear Parents and caregivers

Many young people missed out on measles, mumps and rubella (MMR) immunisation as children. To stop future outbreaks, from Term 2 students are being offered a FREE vaccine at school to help protect them against measles, mumps and rubella.

Most young people will have been given at least one dose of MMR in early childhood. However, changes to the Immunisation Schedule in 2001 and less effective reminder systems before 2005 mean that many teenagers and young adults are not fully protected. Not only will they be protecting themselves against a disease that's **even more contagious than COVID-19**, they will also be protecting your whānau, community, and future generations from harm.

If you have come from overseas, including the Pacific Islands, different vaccines may have been given which means your child may not be protected against measles, mumps and rubella.

If you're not sure or can't find records, the Ministry of Health recommends having the MMR vaccine. Please also speak with your GP.

It's also free at your GP or participating pharmacies.

Consent forms will be coming home with more information soon.
